Some upfront points to remember...

- There are many verses in the Bible applicable to the topic of drinking.
- The Bible clearly has more to say than "don't get drunk".
- We can not simply assume that wine described in the bible is always fresh squeezed juice nor was it the same as the table wines of today.
- This morning we'll examine the scriptural instructions and the facts concerning the use of wine and strong drink by 1st century Christians and how it applies to the alcoholic beverages of our day.

The Negative Effects of Alcohol Consumption are Undisputable...

- 1) Alcohol is Responsible for:
 - 50 percent of all auto fatalities
 - 80 percent of all home violence
 - 33 percent of all suicides
 - 80 percent of all child abuse
 - 70 percent of all drownings
- Children and Alcohol
 - 6.6M children under 18 live with at least one alcoholic parent
 - 80% of HS seniors have used alcohol
 - 51.7% of 8th graders have used alcohol
 - 62.3% of HS seniors have been drunk
 - 25.1% of 8th graders have been drunk
- 3) Statistics Are Overwhelming
 - Over 70% of the people in this country drink.
 - 31.4 million American adults are know alcoholics.
 - One out of seven who take their first drink becomes an alcoholic.

- Addictive even after all of this a desire for more

- Wine treats one with contempt, ridicule and scorn
- Strong drink is quarrelsome and wrangles

- When is one lead astray?

- When is one lead astray?
 - When we set foot on the path leading to wickedness or walk in the way of evildoers
- Instead what are we to do?
 - Avoid it, do not travel on it, turn from it an go on your way

And Yet...

- Some in the church today claim to justify the consumption of beer, wine and mixed drinks from the scriptures
- They are concluding, in their own words, that "all one must do is to avoid sin, ie. drunkenness"
- How are they attempting to reach this conclusion?

Assertions allegedly authorizing the consumption of intoxicating beverages...

- "Wine drinking in the scriptures is shown in both a positive and negative light."
- "There is no "don't drink" passage in the scriptures."
- "The only prohibition in scriptures is the sin of drunkenness."
- "Christ himself made wine for consumption at the wedding in Cana of Galilee."
- "Deacons were instructed to not drink "much" wine, so moderate drinking is ok."

THE CHRISTIAN AND INTOXICATING BEVERAGES

Are we seeking to answer the right question?

Let's first look for the <u>BEST</u> question to be answered...

Can a Christian drink intoxicating beverages?

"If anyone speaks, *let him speak* as the oracles of God." I Peter 4:11 Determining one's authority to participate is a **VERY GOOD** question.

Should a Christian drink intoxicating beverages?

"But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to stumble, it would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were thrown into the sea." Mark 9:42

Also considering impacts beyond oneself is an even **BETTER** question.

 Where did Jesus set the bar for the attitude, behavior and conduct of a Christian regarding intoxicating beverages?

"But I say unto you..." Matt 5:22, 28, 32, 34, 39 & 44

Determining how we should follow the life and instruction of our Savior as laid out in the scriptures is the **VERY BEST** approach.

Jesus laid out clear examples of His "higher standard" in the Kingdom of God in Matthew 5

- ²¹ 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT MURDER' and 'Whoever commits murder shall be liable to the court.'
 - ²² But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be guilty before the court;
- ²⁷ 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY';
 - ²⁸But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.
- ³¹ 'Whoever sends his wife away, let him give her a certificate of divorce';
 - But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except for *the* reason of unchastity, makes her commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

 Provision – to provide easy opportunity to fulfill the lusts of the flesh "But James, Jesus made wine for consumption at the wedding of Cana of Galilee."

 - Some in the church already deal with loneliness, insecurity, worry, problems and are very susceptible to problems with alcohol

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The effects of alcohol intoxication are greatly influenced by individual variations among users. Some users may become intoxicated at a much lower Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) level than is shown.

- 0.02-0.03 BAC: No loss of coordination, slight euphoria and <u>loss of shyness</u>.
 Depressant effects are not apparent.
- 0.04-0.06 BAC: Feeling of well-being, relaxation, <u>lower inhibitions</u>, sensation of warmth. Euphoria. <u>Some minor impairment of reasoning and memory</u>, <u>lowering of caution</u>.
- 0.07-0.09 BAC: Slight impairment of balance, speech, vision, reaction time, and hearing. Euphoria. Judgement and self- control are reduced, and caution, reason and memory are impaired.
- 0.10-0.125 BAC: Significant impairment of motor coordination and loss of good judgement. Speech may be slurred; balance, vision, reaction time and hearing will be impaired. Euphoria. It is illegal to operate a motor vehicle at this level of intoxication.
- 0.13-0.15 BAC: Gross motor impairment and lack of physical control. Blurred vision and major loss of balance. Euphoria is reduced and dysphoria is beginning to appear.
- 0.16-0.20 BAC: Dysphoria (anxiety, restlessness) predominates, nausea may appear. The drinker has the appearance of a "sloppy drunk."
- 0.25 BAC: Needs assistance in walking; total mental confusion. Dysphoria with nausea and some vomiting.
- 0.30 BAC: Loss of consciousness.
- 0.40 BAC and up: Onset of coma, possible death due to respiratory arrest.

How does one...

- Maintain self-control when the first serving lessens self-control
- Use caution to control the amount of drinking when drinking lowers inhibitions and caution?
- Stay on the alert for our adversary the devil when reasoning and judgment are impaired?

Where did Jesus (The Word) set the bar for consuming intoxicating beverages?

Press on to the mark of the high calling of Jesus Christ

Lay aside encumbrances

Didn't Jesus lay out clear examples of necessary "hedges" stopping short of ultimate sins in Matthew 5?

- ²¹ 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT MURDER' and 'Whoever commits murder shall be liable to the court.'
 - But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be guilty before the court;
- ²⁷ 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY';
 - ²⁸But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

What did the wisest man of all time direct as the necessary hedge regarding intoxicating beverages?

Proverbs 23:31

Do not look on the wine when it is red, When it sparkles in the cup, when it goes down smoothly;

Proverbs 4:14-15

14 **Do not set foot on the path** of the wicked or walk in the way of evildoers. 15 **Avoid it**, do not travel on it; turn from it and go on your way.

Conclusion:

Although we may not find an explicit, verbatim "don't drink" statement in the scriptures...

- Multiple scriptures set out a much higher standard of attitude, behavior and conduct for a Christian
 - "Do not look on the wine", "avoid the path of the wicked", "sound judgement", "sober minded", "self control", "no stumbling block", "lay aside every encumbrance that so easily entangle", "make no provision for the flesh in regard to its lusts"

Conclusion:

- The clear choice for a Christian to meet this standard in the scriptures is to abstain from intoxicating beverages of today (beer, wine & mixed drinks) (non-medicinal)
- Considering the facts and Jesus' instruction regarding His higher standard, why would a Christian <u>demand</u> a "don't drink" statement in order to abstain?
